## FAVORITE FRUIT ROLL

### Ingredients:

3 C. flour  
3 Tbsp. sugar  
4 tsp. baking powder  
1 tsp. salt  
1/2 C. shortening  
1 1/4 C. milk  
5-6 med. apples making 3 C. grated  
Sprinkle with cinnamon

### Syrup:

1 1/2 C. sugar  
2 C. water  
5 drops red food coloring (optional)

12" Dutch Oven  
24 Briquets

### How to Prepare:

Mix flour, sugar, baking powder and salt. Cut in shortening and add milk.

On a floured surface, roll into a rectangle approximately 12" x 18". Top with grated apples and lightly sprinkle with cinnamon.

Start with a long side, roll up in jellyroll fashion and cut into 12 equal rolls. Use dental floss or string to score and cut the rolls. The apples contain a lot of juice, rolls will be very moist. Work quickly.

### Syrup:

Bring syrup ingredients to a boil and remove from heat. Gently arrange rolls in hot syrup leaving space between rolls for expansion.

Bake with 8 charcoals on bottom and 18 on top (375?) for 20-25 minutes. Dessert is done when rolls have expanded to fill the entire oven bottom and are golden brown.

### Serving Tip:

Top with a scoop of vanilla ice cream.
