
The final ratification of the by laws will be held at this meeting.

Going beyond the Ordeal weekend

The Ordeal weekend is a one time event for some, but can become a great experience for others. There are the three values, brotherhood, cheerfulness and service that make up the three principles of the Order of the Arrow. The after—Ordeal experience includes a commitment to the Lodge AND a commitment to yourself.

The commitment to the Lodge, is the effort to make a committee or task work. Again, the three principles take a role, but will everyone will benefit by working together, planning and asking past chairmen to give their input. These tasks may not always happen the way you imagined them. If you do some research about the event, talk to others who have that particular experience, they may give you insight for the things that may have gone wrong (so not to repeat the same mistakes) and to focus on how to make the event better. The best way to do this, is to communicate with others in the Lodge during the course of the year. If you are chairing an event, it is important to recruit key members who will be working with you and keep an open line of communication with them throughout the planning stages. The best way to do this is to develop a schedule and stay within the deadlines. This will reduce the stress of the event when it finally happens.

The commitment to yourself, is the experience a committee will give you. You will learn many things — who the committees members, what the committees do, how to give a report, how to plan an event, and what the key roles are. When placed in this position, find out who can help you, watch your abilities increase and don't forget to bring this skill back to your troop. Some other perks available within Aquehongian Lodge are: advisors may also be merit badge counselors, meeting other Lodge members who can help you obtain your goals, and hanging around with another group of dedicated scouts.

Lodge Executive Committee (LEC) meetings are held the last Tuesday of the month at Berlin Lodge at Pouch Camp at 7:30 pm. Lodge meetings are held four times a year. Brotherhood, Ordeal and Conclave weekends are held annually, and the national events such as NOAC, wilderness adventure at Philmont, Seabase, and Northern Tier can be other things to do.
