Commissary Corner

Our brotherhood weekend will be here before we know it. Commissary can always use help. Suggestions for menu items are also welcomed. The conclave will need many kitchen helping hands also. Be the first in your troop to volunteer!

Recipe time: Double Cheese French Onion Soup 4 large onions, thinly sliced and separated into rings 1/2 cup melted butter or margarine 1 tbsp all purpose flour 1 can chicken broth (undiluted) 1 McCormick Au Jus mix packet 2 cups water 1/4 cup dry white wine 1/4 tsp pepper 8 3/4 inch slices French bread (toasted) 8 slices Mozzarella cheese 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese

Mix McCormick au jus packet in 2 cups of water and set aside; Saute onion and butter in Dutch oven or deep frying pan until tender. Blend in flour, stirring until smooth. Gradually add chicken broth, au jus mixture and wine. Bring to a boil; reduce heat and simmer for 30 minutes; add pepper.

Place 8 ovenproof serving bowls on a baking sheet. Place 1 slice of bread in each bowl. Ladle soup over bread. Top with 1 slice of cheese in each bowl. Sprinkle with Parmesan cheese. Broil 6 inches from heat until cheese melts. Yield: 8 cups. Enjoy!
